

Text Content Boxes in Eval25

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



The Text Content boxes configured in **Configuration > Text Content** are located in several places, serve a variety of purposes, and can contain both standard and custom text boxes. For example, all schools using Eval25 will be able to set text for the first box, **Home Page Greeting With Evaluations Completed**, but a school may also have custom evaluation forms on the Text Content page too. The article addresses the 15 standard text boxes (*Setting Name*) and where they appear (*Where it Displays*) in Eval25






<i>Home Page Greeting With Evaluations Completed</i>	Displays in a colored banner on a Student's dashboard (home page for Eval25), just below the <i>My Evaluations</i> heading.	<div><div>My Evaluations</div><div>Hello Jane Smith! <i>Home Page Instructions With Evaluations Completed</i>	Displays on a Student's dashboard, just below the <i>My Evaluations</i> heading and <i>Home Page Greeting With Evaluations Completed</i> .	
<i>Home Page Instructions With Evaluations Not Completed</i>	Displays on a Student's dashboard, below My Evaluations.	
<i>Message for a Successful Submission of an Evaluation</i>	Displays in a green banner on a Student's dashboard, just below the <i>My Evaluations</i> heading.	
<i>Report Disclaimer</i>	Displays in email announcements to any user type, when added as a data field. Report Disclaimer also displays by default in any instructor-sent reminder, although this is only applicable for schools with the "Instructors send reminders" Institution Setting enabled.	

Setting Name	Where it Displays	Example
<i>Default body of instructor reminder emails</i>	Displays in the emails sent by an Instructor to Students who have yet to complete an evaluations for a course.	
<i>Message displayed for unrecognized users</i>	Displays on the Eval25 home page when a user logging in to the system is not recognized.	
<i>Message displayed on the log out page</i>	Displays alone on page after a user has logged out.	
<i>From address of comment redaction emails</i>	<i>From address of comment redaction emails.</i>

<i>Decline Survey URL</i>	Displays to a Student who has declined to take an evaluation.
